Purpose

To brief you on the final results of the RRS Cycle 19.

Key Points:

- 1. RRS Cycle 19 will be finalised on 17 June 2022. The key points to note from Cycle 19 are below:
 - s. 22(1)(a)(ii)

- the introduction of two new program elements in Cycle 19, ParentsNext Education Outcomes and ParentsNext Employment Outcomes. As this was the first time these elements have been tested, both had low compliance rates.
- If both ParentsNext Education Outcomes and ParentsNext Employment Outcomes were excluded from the sample, the compliance rate would have increased to 94.2 per cent of claims either satisfying or mostly satisfying requirements, which is more consistent with recent cycles of the RRS.

- ParentsNext Education Outcomes had the lowest compliance rate with 42.9 per cent of claims either satisfying or mostly satisfying requirements, noting this is the first time that this element has been included in the RRS.




Figure 1: Results by Program Element for Cycle 19

As it is not common practice for RTOs to put this on attainment documents, this was a common deficiency for this program element and was the main contributor to the low compliance rate.


Could we please have a final version of the Edu RRS19 results for our files, as I understand from this extract (below) from^{s. 22(1)(a)(ii)} email on the 15th of June re Cycle 19 Overrides that there are some changes to the final results. My director is chasing these numbers too.

These overrides have been put into place and the Qlik app has been updated. There are 20 records where the final overall result changed, and in all cases it was for the worse. There were several records that originally Satisfies Requirements but now have results of Not Met or Partially Met. The reason I have put in for the override is: "A problem was identified with several formulas within the ParentsNext Education Outcomes Cycle 19 tool. 


