SENATE ORDER FOR ENTITY CONTRACTS LISTING RELATING TO THE PERIOD 1 January 2017-31 December 2017

Pursuant to the Senate Order for Entity Contracts the following table sets out contracts entered into by Department of Education and Training which provide for a consideration to the value of \$100,000 or more (GST inclusive) and which:

- a. have not been fully performed as at 30 December 2017, or
- b. which have been entered into during the 12 months prior to 31 December 2018.

Most of the contracts listed contain confidentiality provisions of a general nature that are designed to protect the confidential information of the parties that may be obtained or generated in carrying out the contract.

The reasons for including such clauses include:
