As a TWES case manager on Yamaji land in Geraldton WA the service requires funding to be attached to each participant so TWES providers can assist in the intern from release to the time an employment service provider picks them up as TWES has no funding to allocate for expenditure on clients.

currently participants leave prison and often cannot be reached by their TWES provider for post release support.

not all Services providers either still are uninformed about TWES or choose to be making the transition into employment difficult.

more workshops working together with ESP and TWES would be of great benefit as I have run these myself.

the Prison I work in Greenough Regional Prison is very supportive of the service and the new superintendent is very proactive in getting employment services to go in for Expos and information sessions.
